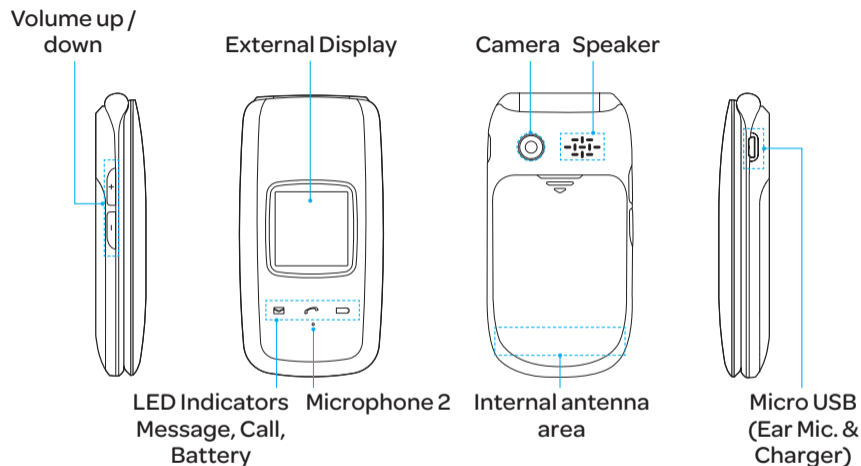
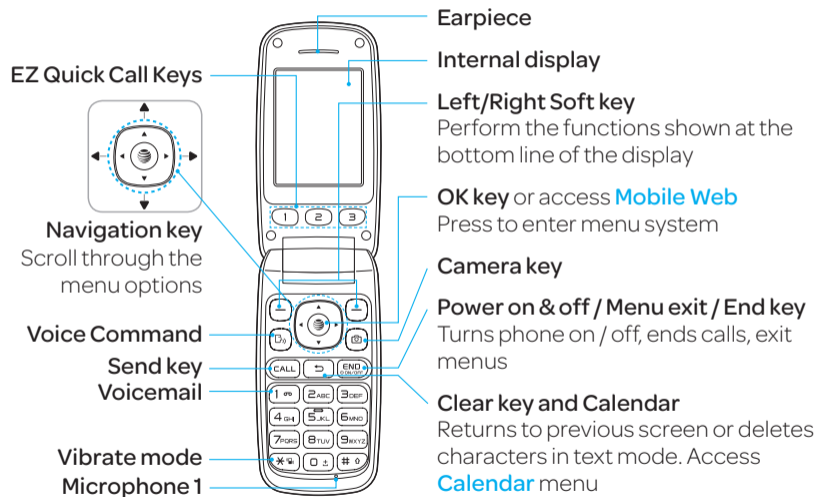

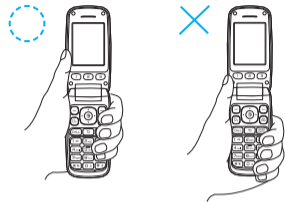

## Using Shortcuts

3. Press **[MND]** for **Phone Mode**.
4. Press the **▲/▼** scroll key to select the mode.







## Quick & Easy

Keys	Functions
	Perform the functions shown at the bottom line of the display by using these soft keys.
	Scroll through the menu options in Menu mode. In standby mode, Left Scroll: Access <b>Mobile Email</b> menu Right Scroll: Access <b>IM</b> menu Up Scroll: Access <b>Create Message</b> menu Down Scroll: Access <b>Address Book</b> menu
	Select a menu function or store user-input information, such as names. Also use this key for confirmation. Launch the <b>Mobile Web</b> directly if pressed in standby mode.
	Delete characters in text mode, or return to previous menu. Open <b>Calendar</b> view if pressed quickly in standby mode.

	Make or receive a call. Show the recent call list in standby mode. Re-dial the last call number if pressed and held in standby mode.
	Complete the current call. Turn on/off the phone if pressed and held. Cancel user input and return to standby mode while in Menu mode.

## SIM card and battery

### About your SIM card

When you subscribe to your network operator, you receive a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card containing your registration information, PIN code, etc. Like a credit card, it should be kept secure and handled carefully. Do not bend, scratch or expose it to moisture. Avoid static electricity.

To avoid corrupting your SIM card's memory, always switch off your phone before removing or inserting your SIM card.

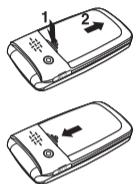
### About your battery

Your phone uses a Li-Ion battery. Make sure to use an authorized battery and charger only. For more details, please inquire at your nearest dealer.

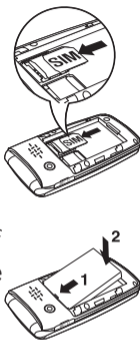
**note:** Your phone is powered by a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. This means that, unlike other forms of battery technology, you can recharge your battery while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect" inherent in those technologies.

## Installing/removing SIM card and battery

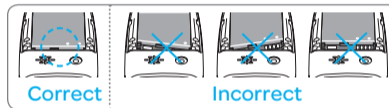
1. Remove the battery cover from the unit. To fit the battery cover, put it on the guide rail and push up.



2. Insert the SIM card into the slot. The gold contacts of the SIM card should go against the metal contacts of the phone. Put the contacts of the battery into the hole located at the bottom of the unit and then insert and press the upper side of the battery until you hear the "click". Make sure you align the gold contacts at the



battery end with contacts on the phone. If the contacts at the battery are not properly aligned, damage could occur to the phone and the battery.



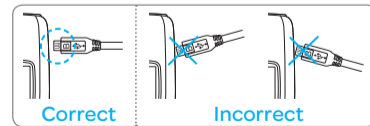
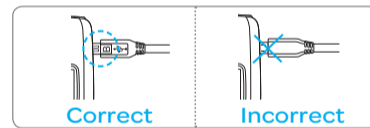
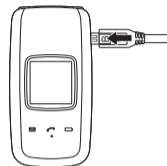
3. To remove the battery, push the bottom of the battery to upwards (1) and remove (2) the battery. Push the SIM card



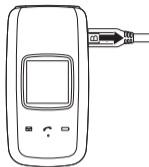
in the arrow direction as shown.

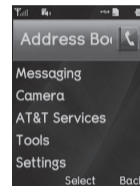

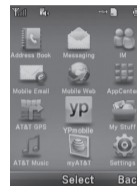
## Setting the phone mode

Your phone has two customized modes, Breeze and Advanced. The default is set to Breeze mode which provides EZ access to the functions used most frequently. In the Breeze mode, you can view an abbreviated menu: **Address Book**, **Messaging**, **Camera**, **AT&T Services**, **Tools** and **Settings**. The **Advanced Mode** allows access to all menu items.





## ABC mode

Press the key labeled with the target letter once for the first letter; press it twice for the second letter, and so on.

1. Press  to change the mode as multi-tap.
2. Press  to  to input text repeatedly. To write the letter "C", press  3 times. To write number 2, press  4 times.

## Predictive mode (T9)

The predictive mode automatically compares your keystrokes with an internal linguistic dictionary to determine

the correct word. It will display the most commonly used first. To save a word not listed in phone's dictionary, select **Options > Predictive Settings > My Words**.

1. Press **# 0** to change the mode to predictive.
2. Press **2 ABC** to **9 WXYZ** to input text. For example, to write 'hello', press **4 GHI** **3 DEF** **5 JKL** **5 JKL** **6 MNO**.

### Number mode

You can input numbers in this mode.

1. Press **# 0** to change the mode to 123.

2. Press **1 00** to **9 WXYZ** and **0 \*** to input numbers.

### Symbol mode

You can input symbols.

1. Press **\* 9** to view the symbols.
2. Press **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select a symbol and select **Insert**.

### EZ quick call keys

Getting in touch with those you call most is now as EZ as 1-2-3.

**note:** The following direction is an example with using **1** key. The usage of **2** and **3** keys will be same as the following.

### To assign a contact to Quick Call

1. Press **1**.
2. Select **Quick Call > Assign**.
3. Select a contact > **Select**.

### To make a call using one touch key

1. Press **1**.
2. Select **Call**.

### To send a message using one touch key

1. Press **1**.
2. Select **Options > Send Message**.

### PC Suite

PC suite is a Windows-based PC program that allows you to easily manage personal data and multimedia files by connecting your Phone to a PC. The PC suite application can be downloaded at <http://www.pantechusa.com>.

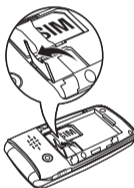

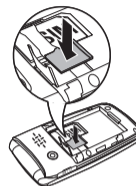
You can use a microSD card as a memory card. It gives you more space to save pictures, videos, music, etc.


### Inserting a memory card

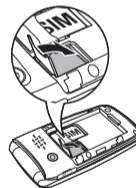
1. Remove the battery cover and the battery from the unit.
2. Unlock the microSD card slot by carefully sliding it up. The metal cover should now be easily lifted up.



3. Insert the microSD card into the slot. The gold contacts of the microSD card should go against the metal contacts of the phone.



4. Close the metal cover and slide down to lock the microSD card in place. The  icon will be displayed when the phone is turned on.



### Using a memory card

You can save, move and delete the files in your phone and external memory card. You can also move and copy the files to computer from your phone.

### To copy a file to the memory card

1. Select a file > **Options** > **Copy to External Memory**.
2. To copy the file back to the phone, select **Options** > **Copy to Phone**.

### To move a file to the memory card

1. Select a file > **Options** > **Move to External Memory**.
2. To move the file back to the phone, select **Options** > **Move to Phone**.

### To delete a file from the memory card

1. Select a file from the card > **Options** > **Delete**.

In **Advanced Mode**, you have access to all of the features of P2030 including the features provided by **Breeze Mode**.

### To move the file from the card to the computer

1. Connect the data cable with mobile and the computer.
2. Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Connectivity**.
3. Select **Select USB Mode**.
4. Select **Music Player**, **Mass Storage** or **Ask on Connection**.
5. Follow the instructions on your computer screen.

**note:** Select **Music Player** when you want to add music to the playlist in your device. When you select **Ask on Connection**, it will ask you to select either the **Music Player** or **Mass Storage** every time you connect your device with your computer.

### Resetting a memory card

1. Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Reset**.
2. Enter the password > select **External Memory Reset**.

**note:** The default password is '1234'.

## Making, receiving and ending a call

### Making a call

1. Enter the area code and phone number.
2. Press **CALL**.

### Answering a call

1. Press **CALL** or select **Accept**.

### Ending a call

1. Press **END**.

Once the call is completed, a call summary is displayed.

### Rejecting a call

Press **END** or select **Ignore**.

## Making a call using the call list

Your phone logs up to 20 dialed, received and missed call numbers.

1. Press **CALL** to display the recent calls list.
2. Select **All Calls**, **Missed Calls**, **Received Calls**, **Dialed Calls** or **Call Ranking** by pressing **◀/▶**.
3. Select a number.
4. Press **CALL** to dial the selected number.

**note:** To redial the last number, press and hold **CALL** in standby mode.

## Making a call during a call

1. Enter the phone number or select **Options** > **View Contacts**.
2. Press **CALL** to dial the second call.  
The first call is automatically put on hold.

## Switching between two calls

1. Select **Options** > **Swap**.

## Making an international call

1. Press and hold **☎** for the international prefix until the '+', character appears.

2. Type the country code, area code, and phone number.
3. Press **CALL**.

## Making an emergency call

1. You can make emergency calls even if your phone does not have a SIM card.
2. Press Emergency Number, or select **SOS** if your phone does not have a SIM card.
3. Press **CALL**.

## Replying to a missed call

1. Press **CALL** to display the calls list.

2. Select **Missed Calls** by pressing ◀/▶.
3. Select a number to call by pressing ▲/▼.
4. Press **CALL**.

### Answering a second call<sup>n</sup>

1. Press **CALL**. The first call is automatically put on hold.
2. Press **END** to end the second call. The call on hold is automatically reconnected.

**note:** For answering a second call, you should activate **Call Waiting** in advance. (Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Call** > **Call Waiting** > **Activate** in Advanced Mode.)

## Options during a call

### Microphone off and on Switching your phone's microphone off

1. Select **Options** > **Mute** [🔇].

### Switching your phone's microphone back on

1. Select **Options** > **Unmute**.

### Talking on speaker

1. Select [🔊].

### Removing background noise

You can eliminate background noise from conversations and improve the voice quality of

communications by setting Noise Suppression to On.

1. Select **Options** > **Noise Suppression**.

### Putting a call on hold and returning<sup>n</sup>

#### Putting a call on hold

1. Select **Options** > **Hold** or press **CALL**.

#### Returning to a held call

1. Select **Options** > **Unhold** or press **CALL** again.

## Multi-party calls<sup>n</sup>

You can talk with more than one person or have a conference call.

### Making a multi-party call

1. Call the first participant.
2. Call the second participant. The first call is automatically put on hold.
3. Select **Options** > **Join**.

### Having a private conversation with one participant

1. Select **Options** > **Split**.
2. Select a participant > **Select**.

## Removing one participant from a multi-party call

1. Select **Options** > **End**.
2. Select the number associated with the call you wish to end or **End All** to end all calls.

## Searching for a number in address book during a call

1. Select **Options** > **View Contacts**.
2. Select a number, and then press **CALL**.

## Searching for a name or group in address book

Enter the first letters of the name for Name Search. The entries are displayed starting with the first entry matching your input.

## Finding a name manually in address book

1. Press **▲/▼**.

## Viewing the details of highlighted entry in address book

1. Select **Select**.

*For details on address book, see page 43.*

## Reading a message during a call

1. Select **Options** > **View Message**.
2. Select a conversation > **Open**.
3. Select a message > **View**.

## Sending a message during a call

1. Select **Options** > **Send Message**.

*For details on creating a text message, see page 49.*

## Mobile Web <sup>n</sup>

1. Select **Options** > **Mobile Web**.

## Viewing the calendar during a call

1. Select **Options** > **View Calendar**.

## Making a note during a call

1. Select **Options** > **Notepad**.

## Voice recording

1. Select **Options** > **Voice Recording**.

## Checking all calls

You can view information about all calls simply by pressing **CALL**. For more options for all, missed, received, dialed calls, and call

ranking, select an entry and **Options**.

### Viewing missed calls

1. Select **Shortcuts** in standby mode.
2. Select **Recent Calls > Missed Calls**.

## Alert message

If you experience any problem while using your mobile phone, please refer to the following checklist. If the problem still persists, contact your dealer or nearest carrier.

### When the *“Insert SIM Card”* message appears:

Make sure the SIM card is correctly installed. Check to see if the SIM card is working properly. If it does not work, try to clean the contact points of the card with a dry cloth. If it is out of order, take it to your service provider.

### When the *“Messages full”* message appears:

The received or saved messages are full in your phone memory. You need to delete the message to receive or send messages.

### When the *“Phone and SIM messages is full. Delete Messages”* message appears:

The received or saved messages are full in your phone and SIM card memory. You need to delete the message to receive or send messages.

### When the *“Password”* message appears in Phone locked state:

Enter the phone password. The default password is “1234”. If you cannot remember the password, contact the nearest carrier.

### When the *“Enter PIN1”* message appears:

Input PIN1. If you cannot remember it, contact your service provider. You can still receive calls even if your mobile phone becomes locked after entering the incorrect PIN1 on three consecutive attempts.

**When the other party cannot hear you speaking:**

**When battery lifetime is shorter than usual:**

This may happen when you are in an area with low signal strength. Turn off your phone when it is not in use. Change the battery when battery energy is exhausted.

**When your mobile phone does not turn on:**

Make sure your battery is charged. Check to see if your phone works while recharging the battery.

**When you are unable to send a message:**

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aids.

The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to

telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities.

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with

their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

- **M-Ratings:** Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

- **T-Ratings:** Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health

professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise. The hearing aid and wireless phone rating values are then added together. A sum of 5 is considered acceptable for normal use. A sum of 6 is considered for best use.



In the above example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless phone meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equal M5. This is

synonymous for T ratings. This should provide the hearing aid user with “normal usage” while using their hearing aid with the particular wireless phone. “Normal usage” in this context is defined as a signal quality that is acceptable for normal operation.

The M mark is intended to be synonymous with the U mark. The T mark is intended to be synonymous with the UT mark. The M and T marks are recommended by the Alliance for Telecommunications Industries Solutions (ATIS). The U and UT marks are referenced



in Section 20.19 of the FCC Rules. The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

To ensure that the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your phone is maintained, secondary transmitters such as Bluetooth and WLAN components must be disabled during a call. See page 81 for instructions to disable these components.
