This User Guide contains important and useful information that will maximize your familiarity with all that Pantech Burst has to offer.

Some of the contents in this manual may differ from your phone depending on the software of the phone. Actual color of the phone may vary.

Your phone is designed to make it easy for you to access a wide variety of content. For your protection, we want you to be aware that some applications that you enable may involve the location of your phone being shared. For applications available through AT&T, we offer privacy controls that let you decide how an application may use the location of your phone and other phones on your account. However, the AT&T privacy tools do not apply to applications available outside of AT&T. Please review the terms and conditions and the associated privacy policy for each location-based service to learn how location information will be used and protected. In addition, your AT&T phone may be used to access the internet and to download, and/or purchase goods, applications, and services from AT&T or elsewhere from third parties. AT&T provides tools for you to control access to the Internet and certain Internet content. These controls may not be available for certain devices which bypass AT&T controls.

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Important Safety Information

Safety information

The following list shows how to maintain your mobile phone and precautions to take as you use the device.

- Keep your mobile phone and its accessories out of the reach of children and pets.
- Maintain your mobile phone in dry conditions and keep it within normal operating temperatures. It may be damaged at temperatures higher than 55°C/131°F or lower than -20°C/-4°F.
- Do not dry your phone in a microwave oven. Sparks may occur and cause an explosion or fire.
- Do not use or store your mobile phone in dusty, dirty areas.
- Do not disassemble your mobile phone.
- Do not drop or cause severe impact to your mobile phone.
- Do not clean your mobile phone with chemical products, cleaning solvents or detergents.
- Contact your dealer immediately if your mobile phone does not work properly.
- Use only authorized batteries, battery chargers, and accessories. Any malfunction or damage caused by the use of unauthorized batteries, battery chargers and, accessories will void the limited product warranty.
- Ensure that the battery and the battery charger do not come in contact with conductive objects.
- For optimal performance, use cases and accessories that do not contain magnets.

Safety precautions

The following list shows precautions to keep your device as you use it.

- · Using a mobile phone while driving is prohibited.
- Using a mobile phone while driving can distract your attention and cause an accident. Always switch your phone off to drive safely.
- In an emergency, use a hands-free device built into your car or pull over in a safe place first.
- Check local laws and regulations and comply with them, with regard to the prohibition of mobile phone use while driving.

Turn off in restricted areas

Always switch your phone off in areas where mobile phone use is restricted

Switch off in an aircraft

Always switch your phone off or select the airplane mode (Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Airplane mode) when you are in an aircraft. Electromagnetic waves emitted by your phone may affect the electronic navigation equipment in the aircraft.

Switch off in hospitals and near medical equipment

Always switch your phone off in hospitals and obey their regulations. Switch your phone off when using medical equipment for private purposes. Always consult with the medical equipment's manufacturer or an expert regarding phone use near the medical equipment.

Switch off in dangerous areas

Always switch your phone off in areas where explosive or dangerous materials (e.g. fuels or chemical products) are located and obey relevant instructions or signs. Do not insert or remove your mobile phone's battery in such areas.

Install a hands-free device in a safe location

Install a hands-free device away from the steering wheel and airbag expansion areas. Otherwise, you can be injured in a car accident.

Keep away from other electronic devices

Mobile phones emit electromagnetic waves that may affect nearby electronic devices. After switching on your phone, do not place it close to other electronic goods.

About battery usage

Your phone is powered by a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. In other words, you can recharge your battery while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect."

- Do not use a damaged battery or charger.
- Do not disassemble, open crush, bend, deform, puncture or shred the battery.
- Do not modify or remanufacture, insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard.
- · Do not put your battery in contact with conductive objects.
- Dispose of and recycle used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Do not dispose of batteries by burning; they may explode.

- · Do not use an unauthorized charger or battery.
- · Use the battery only for the device for which it is specified.
- Use the battery with a charging device that has been qualified for the device per this standard. Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.
- Do not short circuit a battery or allow metallic conductive objects to contact battery terminals.
- Replace the battery only with another battery that has been qualified with the device per this standard, IEEE-Std-1725-2006.
- · Children should be supervised when they use the battery.
- Avoid dropping the phone or the battery. If the phone or the battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and the user suspects damage, take it to a service center for inspection.
- · Use your battery for the specified purpose only.
- The closer you move to your network's base station, the longer you can use your phone because less battery power is required for connection.
- The battery recharging time varies depending on the remaining battery capacity and the battery and charger type.
- · Battery life inevitably shortens over time.
- Since overcharging may shorten battery life, remove the phone from its charger once it is fully charged. Unplug the charger once charging is complete. Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, especially inside a car in summer or winter, may reduce its capacity and life.
- To prevent injury or burns, ensure that no metal objects come into contact with the + and - terminals of the battery.

Basic instructions

Useful tips

To understand information contained in this user guide, please keep in mind the following:

- It is assumed that you start operating applications of the phone from the Applications screen.
 - 1. Tap on the home screen to access the applications menu screen.
 - 2. Flick the screen right or left and select to run the application you want to use.





Main home screen

Applications menu screen

- Words in bold type refer to the relevant action on the screen. For example, "Tap Create new contact." in this instruction manual leads you to follow the correct actions. In this way, you will tap the onscreen menu, "Create new contact," in the Contacts menu window.
- Words in all capital letters refer to hard keys. For example, LOCK/PWR indicates the lock/power key on the top left of the handset that locks the screen or turns on/off power.

- The symbol ">" refers to the next action. For example, "Tap Settings > Language & keyboard" means that you should tap Settings first and Language & keyboard next.
- The term, 'Applications menu' refers to the screen where all applications of the phone appear.
- Home screen refers to the screen that appears first when you unlock the screen.
- Idle mode refers to the status when you stay on the home screen ready to run an application.

About Google accounts

It is recommended that you have a Google account to use some applications provided by Google, e.g. Calendar, Latitude, Market, Talk and Gmail of the phone. For more information on setting up a Google account, refer to Creating a Google account on page 21.

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1. Getting Started

Follow the outlined steps that should be taken first before using the Burst.

Inside the package

The package should contain the following items:

- Handset
- · Battery
- · USB/Wall Charger
- Quick Start Guide

SIM/USIM card and battery

About the SIM/USIM card

When you subscribe to the network operator, you receive the Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card or the Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card that contains your registration information, PIN code, etc. You should keep it secure and handle carefully. Do not bend, scratch or expose it to moisture. Avoid static electricity.

About the battery

The phone uses a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. Make sure to use the authorized battery and charger only. Maximum hours to use the battery might vary depending on service types offered by the service provider and temperatures. For more details, contact your nearest dealer.

① Note The Li-Ion battery can be recharged while some charge remains without reducing your phone's autonomy due to the "battery memory effect" inherent in those technologies.

Installing the SIM/USIM card and battery

- 1. Remove the battery cover from the unit.
 - To remove the battery cover, place your finger nail in the groove at the bottom of the unit, and then lift it up.



2. Insert the SIM/USIM card into the slot. Ensure that the gold contacts of the card go against the metal contacts of the phone.



3. Slide the connector of the battery into the notch located at the top of the unit. Insert and press the lower side of the battery until you hear a click. Make sure you align the gold contacts on the battery end with the contacts on the phone. If the contacts on the battery are not properly aligned, the phone and the battery could be damaged.



 To remove the battery, lift the bottom of the battery up and remove. To remove the SIM card, slide the SIM card in the direction of the arrow as shown.





 To place the battery cover back onto the unit, slide the one end of the cover into the groove, and then push it down.

Charging the battery

Connect with the charger adapter on the top right side.
 Make sure you align the connector as shown in the image.



- ① Note Make sure to align the connector as shown in the image. Otherwise, the charging connector will be damaged and the battery will not be charged.
- Disconnect the charger from the phone when the battery is fully charged.



About the Internal memory


The internal memory is divided into two areas: internal system storage and internal media storage. Downloaded and preload applications are saved in the Internal system storage. Pictures and video files taken with the built-in camera, downloaded music files or attachments downloaded from MMS, Emails or web browser are saved in the Internall media storage. For downloaded applications, you can move them to Internal media storage through the Settings menu. When you insert the SD card on the phone, you can change the default save location.

Managing the memory card

You should manage the microSD card carefully. If you do not follow the steps described below to manage the memory card, you can incur serious damage to the card.

Installing the microSD™ card

- 1. Remove the battery cover from the unit.
- Insert the microSD™ card into the slot. Ensure that the gold contacts of the card go against the metal contacts of the phone.



3. To remove the memory card, slide the memory card out in the opposite direction of the arrow.

About the microSD™ card

A microSD™ card is a removable flash memory card where you can save data. Save pictures and contacts, and download applications to the SD card. You can expand the external memory space up to 32GB.

It is recommended that you format the microSD $^{\text{TM}}$ card before using the phone.

Viewing available memory

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Storage.
- 3. Flick the screen and check the status of the SD card and internal phone storage.

Unmounting the SD Card

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Storage > Unmount SD card > OK.
- 3. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key.
- 4. Tap Power off > OK.
- 5. Open the battery cover.
- 6. Remove the battery.
- 7. Remove the SD card.
- ① Note If you want to mount the SD card, tap Settings > Storage > Mount SD card.

Formatting the microSD card

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Storage > Unmount SD card > OK.
- 3. Tap Erase SD card > Erase SD card > Erase everything.

Turning the phone on/off

To turn on

1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key for a few seconds.

To turn off

- 1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key.
- 2. Tap Power off.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Unlocking the screen

The screen is locked by default when you turn on power. To unlock the screen:

- 1. Press the LOCK/PWR key.
- 2. Drag an icon to the center of the screen to unlock.
- 3. Draw a pattern if the screen is protected by pattern lock. Enter a PIN or a password if the screen is locked by a PIN or a password.

For more information on screen lock, refer to **Location & security** in Settings on page 76.



Locking the screen

Lock the screen to protect information or conserve battery life. To lock the screen, press the LOCK/PWR key.




① Note Make sure not to cover the proximity sensor with the LCD protection film. If the sensor is covered, you might have difficulty using the touch screen.

Using 3.5 PI Stereo Earphones

You can control your stereo earphone by inserting the stereo earphone's plug into Ear jack on the phone.

① NoteThe stereo earphones that support common call management features including making and answering calls have not been standardized. Therefore, the phone may not be compatible with some stereo earphones.

Using the touch screen

Run an application or perform functions using the touch screen. The following finger actions help you easily understand how to use the touch screen and the phone.

Tap: Tap once to access a menu or an option.

Double tap: Tap an item twice.

Drag: Tap and hold your finger on an item and move it without losing contact with the screen.

Flick: Place a finger on the screen and move the screen up or down, or left or right.

Pinch: Place two fingers on the screen and move them apart to zoom in a picture, a document or a web page, or move them together to zoom out.

Select and tap: Tap one in the list of options available.

Press and hold: Press screen or key for a few seconds.

① Note Use one finger at a time except when you deal with a picture or a document. The phone will not recognize it when you use more than two fingers at the same time.

△ CAUTION

- Do not use sharp tools that can scratch the touch screen.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water or chemicals. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or in chemicals.
- Do not sit on the phone. The touch screen can be damaged.

Understanding the home screen

The Home screen is where you'll find all your applications. You can have up to 7 Home screens and browse them with a flick.

Navigating the home screen

The phone provides seven different screens where you can place items according to your preference.

- 1. Flick the screen from the left to the right or vice versa.
- 2. Tap a desired application or widget to run.





Sample home screens

Using the blind mode for home screen

By hiding the icons and widgets, you can enjoy the wallpaper in a full view.

- 1. Spread your two fingers apart on the home screen to hide icons and widgets on the home screen.
 - The blind mode is activated.
- 2. Pinch two fingers together on the home screen to show the icons and widgets on the home screen.
 - The blind mode is deactivated.

① Note You can deactivate the blind mode by pressing any hard key on the handset, and the blind mode is activated on the entire home screens.

Managing running applications

- Press and hold while you are using an application. Applications that are running in the background appear.
- Select and tap an application on the screen if you want to resume your work with the application.
- Tap X if you want to force the application to close. Press = and tap Close all if you want to stop all applications at once that are running.
- ① Note Make sure to press sand move to the home screen if you want to finish using an application. Otherwise, the application continues to run and will take memory and consume battery.

Customizing the home screen

Adding a shortcut

- 1. Press and hold an empty space on the home screen.
- 2. Tap Shortcuts.
- 3. Select and tap an item among those that can be added as a shortcut.
 - You will find the shortcut on the home screen.







Adding a widget

- 1. Press and hold an empty space on the home screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- 3. Tap either Android Widgets or Pantech Widgets.
- 4. Select and tap a widget among those in the list.
 - You will find the widget on the home screen.
- ① Note Make sure to secure enough room on the screen for a widget. Depending on the type of the widget, you have to delete another widget or shortcut or rearrange them.

Creating a wallpaper from the Gallery

- Press and hold an empty space on the home screen and tap Wallpapers, or press in idle mode and tap Wallpaper.
- 2. Tap Gallery.
- 3. Select and tap a picture and adjust the size.
- 4. Tap Save.
- ① Note If you want to create a live wallpaper, tap Wallpapers > Live wallpapers, select the desired wallpaper and tap Set wallpaper.

 When you set the wallpaper with Live wallpapers or Maps, the battery drains faster than when setting photos as wallpaper.

Deleting a shortcut or a widget on the home screen

- 1. Press and hold a shortcut or widget you want to delete.
- 2. Drag it to in on the bottom of the screen and release it.



Changing the theme of the home screen

- Press
 ≡ in idle mode and tap Themes. The User theme
 (Unsaved) is selected by default.
- 2. Select and tap a theme for the home screen among contextual themes and tap **Done**.
- Tap Yes in the saving theme screen, enter the name of the user theme and tap Done. The home screen appears under the new name.

Deleting the user theme from the home screen

- 1. Press in idle mode and tap Themes.
- 2. Select and tap one of the user themes on the top of the screen
- 3. Press and tap Delete.
- 4. Tap in next to the user theme to delete and tap **Done**.

Changing the order of screens

- 1. Press and hold **=** in idle mode.
- 2. Press and hold a screen and drag it to the new position.
- 3. Tap a screen or press ☆ or ★ if you want to go back to the home screen.



① Note You can also change the order of screens by pinching in two fingers on the home screen.

Checking Easy Settings and Notifications

Easy Settings help manage a few important functions easily and check ongoing events.

- Tap on the top of the home screen and drag it down, or press
 ≡ in idle mode and tap Notifications.
- 2. Tap an icon in Easy Setting that you want to run. The icon turns red when the function is activated.
- 3. Tap an ongoing event message if you want to run the relevant application.
- 4. Tap Clear if you want to remove notifications from the bar.



Selecting a language

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Select language.
- 2. Select and tap a language that you want to use.
- ① **Note** It is recommended to set the language option first before using other functions.

Viewing Applications


- 1. Tap 1 to view the applications on the home screen.
- Press and tap the desired menu option to arrange the applications view.
 - **List View**: Arranges the applications in the alphabetical order.
 - **Sort**: Selects the desired grid view for your preference.
 - **Background**: Selects the desired background image for your application screen.
 - **Share**: Shares the applications with other users by sending an email or message.
 - **Uninstall**: Uninstalls the application that you don't want to include in your device.

Managing Applications

- 1. Tap **=** on the home screen.
- 2. Tap Manage apps.
- 3. Select and tap an application to manage.

Gripping the phone

Hold the phone in the right position for a call as shown in the below image:



- Make sure not to block the internal antenna embedded in the phone. Check the location of the intenna on the illustration on page 12.
- · Metal accessories can affect the quality of calls.

Activating the phone

Go through the following steps when you turn on the phone for the first time.

Learning how to use the phone

- 1. Press and hold the LOCK/PWR key to turn on the phone.
- 2. Tap the Android logo on the screen.
- 3. Select and tap a language for the phone and tap Next.
- "Wi-Fi Network detected" appears if the Wi-Fi network has been detected. Tap Connect to Wi-Fi network > Next if you want to establish a connection to the Wi-Fi network. Or tap Next if you want to connect to the Wi-Fi network later.
- 5. Select and tap an available Wi-Fi network if you have tapped

- Connect to Wi-Fi network > Next in step 2. Follow the necessary steps to connect to the Wi-Fi network. For more information, refer to page 22.
- Tap See location in applications (such as Maps) using wireless networks to Use Google location service. Tap Agree for Location consent, and tap Next.
- Tap Google account if you want to set up a Google account and follow the necessary steps, or just tap Next. For more information on creating a Google account, refer to the next section.
- 8. Check how to unlock screen and tap Skip.
- ① Note You can do all of these steps later by tapping Tutorial.

Creating a Google account

After finishing learning how to use the phone:

- 1. Tap 🖸
- 2. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync > Add account.
- 3. Tap Google > Next > Create.
- 4. Enter your first name, last name and user name for the account, and tap Next. The user name should be 6-30 characters long. You can select an alternative.
- Tap Next > Connect to Wi-Fi if you have not connected the phone to the Wi-Fi network and follow the instructions.



- 6. Enter a password and enter it again to confirm. You should enter at least 8 characters.
- 7. Tap Next.
- 8. Select and tap a security question and enter an answer.
- 9. Enter a secondary email address and tap Create.
- 10. Tap I agree, Next for the Google Terms of Service.
- 11. Tap **Try again** if your password is too weak for a password or contains invalid characters.
- 12. Repeat the steps 5 to 9.
- 13. Type the characters that appear on the screen and tap Next.
- 14. Tap Finish.
- 15. Tap Sync Contacts if you want to synchronize your contacts. Tap Sync Gmail if you want to synchronize Gmail. Tap Sync Books if you want to synchronize your books. Tap Sync Calendar if you want to synchronize your calendar.

16. Tap Finish setup.

① **Note** Steps for connecting to Wi-Fi network and Google location service might not appear if you have already done with them.

2. Connectivity

This chapter introduces useful tips on how to connect to the network available that enables applications of the phone to run.

Using a Wi-Fi network

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi to activate the function.
- Select and tap a network. You should enter the password if the network is secured. indicates a secured Wi-Fi network.
- 5. Tap **Connect**. Once the network is remembered, the phone will automatically connect to it when in range.



Activating Wi-Fi



Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

① Note The icon next to each network indicates the strength of the signal and the Google sign-in status. For example, a indicates the signal is poor while indicates the signal is strong. And indicates the status of being signed in to Google account while indicates the staus of being signed out of Google account.

About network notifications

You are informed by default when a Wi-Fi network is available around you. The message an in the status bar indicates a network is available. Tap **Network notification** in the Wi-Fi settings if you do not want to be informed the availability of the network.

Setting Wi-Fi networks

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi to activate the function.
- 4. Tap **Automatic connection** to connect to AT&T hotspot.
- Tap WPS button connection if you want to establish a new wireless connection using the Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS). You should press WPS button or enter PIN on your Wi-Fi access point within two minutes.

Using the Easy Setting

- Tap on the top of the screen and drag it down, or press in idle mode and tap Notifications.
- 2. Tap in Easy Setting. The icon turns red when the function is on.

Searching for Wi-Fi networks

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- Tap Wi-Fi to activate the function. the phone scans networks automatically every six seconds. The newly found networks appear on the bottom of the list.

Adding a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi to activate the function.
- 4. Tap Add Wi-Fi network.
- Enter Network SSID and select the security type among Open, WEP, WPA/WPA2 PSK, or 802.1x EAP. Aside from Open, you must enter a password for the network.
- 6. Tap Save.

Disconnecting a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Tap the network that is connected to the phone.
- 2. Tap Forget to disconnect the network.
- ① **Note** You can also disconnect the Wi-Fi network by pressing and holding the network and tapping **Forget network**.

Connecting to a Mobile Network

You can use 3G (or EDGE if available) or 4G(LTE) to connect the phone to the Internet and exchange multimedia messages. You will need a data plan to access a 2G, 3G or 4G network.

The settings are already preconfigured on the phone, and it is ready to use 3G or 4G services. Please do not change the settings: this may cause services to stop working.

- ① Note Using 3G or 4G loads Internet data faster in some cases, but may decrease battery performance. When you use 3G or 4G, data charges may be imposed.
- ① Note When data is transmitted over the network, sound interferences may occur near electronic products like audio players or telephones.

Using Bluetooth

Bluetooth function enables wireless connections between electronic devices. Using this function, you can send images, text, and business cards.

With Bluetooth function, the phone provides:

- Connection to hands-free devices.
- · Connection to electronic devices.

Pairing with devices

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth to activate the function.
- 4. Tap Scan for devices.
- 5. Select and tap a device from the list.
- 6. Tap Pair to connect to and pair with the device.

Using the Easy Setting

- Tap on the top of the home screen and drag it down, or press in idle mode and tap Notifications.
- 2. Tap 🔞 in Easy Setting. The icon turns red when the function is on.

Bluetooth settings

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth to activate the function.
- 4. Tap **Discoverable** if you want to let other people pair their devices with the phone. The status lasts for 120 seconds.

Sharing a picture using Bluetooth

- 1. Tap **Gallery** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a picture to share.
- 3. Tap Menu > Share > Bluetooth.
- 4. Select and tap a device among those paired with the phone. The other party will receive a message to accept the file.

Renaming the device

- 1. Tap Settings from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 3. Tap **Bluetooth** to activate the function.
- 4. Tap **Device name** and enter a new name.
- 5. Tap **OK**.

Making the phone a modem

The phone provides other devices with an Internet connection.

Activating the USB Tethering

- Connect the phone with an electronic device using the USB cable.
- 2. Tap Settings from the applications menu.
- 3. Tap Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Tap **USB tethering** to activate the function. The electronic device that is connected to the phone can now access the Internet.
- ① **Note** You cannot use a few applications that require Internet connection while using tethering.

Becoming a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1. Tap Settings from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3. Tap **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot**. The phone can offer the Internet connection to other devices around you.

Setting options for portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- Tap Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3. Tap Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings > Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 4. Enter a name for Network SSID. Tap **Hide SSID** if you want to hide the SSID

5. Tap **WPA2(AES)** for security and select the related items if you want to allow limited devices to access the Internet through the phone, and tap **Save**.



Configuring Wi-Fi hotspot

① Note A password for the security type is randomly set to 8 digit numbers. You can see the password by selecting the "Show password" check box.

Connecting to a PC

You can synchronize files and exchange data with a computer using the PC data cable. Keep in mind that you cannot transfer media files if you turn on the USB debugging mode (Settings > Applications > Development > USB debugging).

Selecting the USB mode

- 2. Tap Storage > USB Mode.

 - Tap Media Transfer > OK if you want to transfer media files between the phone and your PC when they are connected.

- 4. Connect the USB cable to the phone.
- 5. Connect the other end of the cable to your computer.

Using the phone as Mass Storage

You can copy files between your computer and the microSD™ card in the phone. In the mass storage mode, a few applications—Handy Memo, Voice Memo, Sketch Pad, Music Player, Camera, Camcorder, Document Viewer—that need the microSD™ card will not run.

Copying files

- 1. Connect the phone to your computer using the USB cable.
- 2. Set the USB mode for mass storage.
- 3. Tap Turn on USB storage > OK.
- 4. Select and copy files to transfer from the phone.
- 5. Paste files to your PC.



① Note Tap Turn off USB storage in the notifications screen if you want to turn off the function.

Transferring files through Media Transfer

MTP stands for Media Transfer Protocol and it is a communication method specifically optimized for the transfer of audio and video file types. With the MTP connection on, you can transfer media files between your computer and the microSD™ card in the phone. Once you have turned on the MTP connection, media files are collected through Windows Media Player 11 or higher.

Transferring files

- Set the USB mode for Media Transfer
- 2. Select files to transfer from the phone or your PC.
- 3. Transfer files to your PC or the phone.



Turning on/off the USB mode in the Easy Setting

Answering and ending a call

- Tap End to end a call during the conversation. After ending a call, its summary is shortly displayed.



Adjusting the volume

- Press the upper volume key to increase the volume during a call.
- 2. Press the lower volume key to decrease the volume during a call.
- ① Note Press the volume key in idle mode if you want to adjust the ringer volume. If you want to set it to the vibration mode, press the volume key all the way down until the mode appears.
- ① Note You can disable or enable the noise suppression function during a call. Tap => Noise Suppression. Tap On or Off if you turn on or off the speaker. Or tap in hand, on desk, or Off if you turn on the speaker. For more information about the noise suppression function, refer to page 75.

Holding and unholding a call

- 1. Tap **Hold** during a call. The party will hear nothing.
- 2. Tap **Unhold** to resume the call.
- 3. Tap **End** to finish the call.



Swapping a call for a multiparty call

Making a conference call

- 3. Tap **Add call** to invite a third party to the call
- 4. Tap **Merge calls** to let all the parties to participate in the conversation.



Checking your voice mail

- 1. Tap 🜈.
- 2. Press and hold 1 on the keypad.
- ① Note The screen moves to the voice mail contact editing screen if the number has not been designated for the voice mail.

Making a call from the Address Book

- 1. Tap 🌈
- 2. Tap Contacts, select and tap a contact to call.
- 3. Tap Call home, Call mobile or Call work according to your preferences.

Making an emergency call

- 1. Tap Emergency call when the screen is locked.
- 2. Tap 911 or other numbers you set as emergency numbers.

Checking missed calls

- 2. Tap Call log and check missed calls.
- 3. Select and tap a number to call back.
- 4. Tap a if you want to make a call to the number.

Checking the call history

- 2. Tap Call log.
- 3. Select and tap a contact to see.
- 4. Tap fif you want to make a call to the contact.
- ① Note The displayed call time is not equal to the call charge.

Saving a new contact

- 2. Enter a telephone number.
- 3. Press and tap Add to contacts.
- 4. Tap Create new contact.
- 5. Enter necessary information of the contact and tap ${\bf Save}.$

Talking through the speaker

- Tap Speaker during a call. A white bar appears under Speaker when the function is on.
- 2. Tap Speaker if you want to stop using the function.
- ① **Note** If a headset is connected to the phone, the speaker does not work.

Talking through the Bluetooth

- Tap Bluetooth during a call. A white bar appears under Bluetooth when the function is on.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth** if you want to stop using the function.
- ① **Note** Refer to the relevant manual of the Bluetooth headset for more information.

Muting the phone

- 1. Tap **Mute** during a call. A white bar appears under **Mute** when the function is on.
- 2. Tap Mute if you want to turn off the function.

Adding a call

- 1. Tap **Add call** to make a call to another party during a call with a party.
- 2. Enter the telephone number and tap 🚹
- ① **Note** The current call is held when you make a call with another party.

Using the Local Search

- Tap Change. (You can specify the location where you want to find business)
 - If you don't change, it would do a search near current location by default.

About Swype

Swype is a fast and easy way to enter a message. For example, drag your finger on the screen keyboard as shown and input "Quick".



Compass helps you find your location using the speed and the distance of your moving. Turn on the GPS function to use.

- ① **Note** When there is interference on the compass, keep it away from the interfering items or wave the phone in a figure 8 motion.

- 3. Select and tap a document to read.
- 4. Tap anywhere on the screen while a document is open.
- 5. Tap and tap a to zoom in the document or tap to zoom out in landscape mode. Drag downwards or upwards to zoom in or out in portrait mode. You can also zoom in the document by pinching your fingers apart, and zoom out by pinching your fingers together.
- 6. Tap if you want to fit the document to width.
- 7. Tap if you want to fit the document to height.







Searching for words in a document

- Tap **Document Viewer** from the applications menu.
- 2. Open a document.
- 3. Press and tap Word Search.
- 4. Enter a word to search for and tap **Done** in the virtual keyboard.
- 6. Tap **Done** if you want to stop searching for the word.

Moving to a page in a document

- 4. Press and tap Go to Page.

- 1. Tap **Document Viewer** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a folder where you have stored documents.
- 3. Press and hold a document to share, and tap Share.
- Tap Bluetooth, Facebook, Gmail, Messaging or Twitter. Channels might vary depending on the document type.

Deleting documents

- 1. Tap **Document Viewer** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a folder where you have stored documents.
- 3. Press and hold a document to delete, and tap **Delete > Yes**.

Renaming documents

- 1. Tap **Document Viewer** from the applications menu.
- 2. Select and tap a folder where you have stored documents.
- 3. Press and hold a document to rename, and tap **Rename**.
- 4. Enter the new name and tap **Save**.

7. Settings

This chapter explains how to change the settings of the phone. Access the settings from Applications or simply do it on the home screen by pressing **=** and tapping **Settings**.

Personalize

Setting and managing home screen themes

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Themes.
- 2. Select a predefined theme or a user-saved theme that you want to apply to the home screen.
- 3. Tap **Done**. The selected theme will be applied to the home screen.

Setting home wallpaper

- 1. Tap Settings > Personalize > Home Wallpaper.
- 2. Tap Gallery, Live wallpapers or Wallpapers.
- Select an image you want to use as wallpaper and tap Set wallpaper.
- ① **Note** When you set the wallpaper with Live wallpapers or Maps, the battery drains faster than when setting with photos.

Wireless & networks

Setting Airplane mode

- Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Airplane mode.
 If you turn on Airplane mode, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and GPS functions are turned off at once. However, you can turn on each function for your preference.
- 2. Tap Airplane mode again to reactivate other functions.

Setting Wi-Fi networks

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap **Wi-Fi settings** to manage the wireless network. Refer to page 22 for more information.

Setting Bluetooth

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth settings** to manage the wireless technology option. Refer to page 24 for more information.

Setting Tethering and portable hotspots

- Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Tap USB tethering to provide Internet connection to other devices. You should connect the phone with your other device through the USB cable.
- Tap Portable Wi-Fi hotspot to make the phone a portable Wi-Fi hotspot. Refer to page page 24 for more information.

Setting VPN settings

- Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > VPN settings > Add VPN.
- Tap Add PPTP VPN, Add L2TP VPN, Add L2TP/IPSec PSK VPN or Add L2TP/IPSec CRT VPN.
- 3. Set up the network by entering necessary information.

Setting mobile networks

- 1. Tap Settings > Wireless & networks > Mobile networks.
- Tap Data Services to allow access to data over mobile network.
- 3. Tap International Data roaming to connect to data services when roaming and tap OK.
- ① Note You may incur significant roaming charges.
- Tap Access Point Names and tap the desired access point names to edit. You can add a new APN by pressing and tapping New APN.

Call settings

Fixed dialing number is a service that limits your access to specific numbers recorded on the SIM.

Managing fixed dialing numbers

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Fixed Dialing Numbers.
- 2. Tap Enable FDN, Change PIN2 or FDN list.
- 3. Enter necessary information.

Setting your voicemail

- Tap Settings > Call settings > Voicemail settings > Voicemail number.
- 2. Enter the voicemail number or tap 1 and select a contact to designate as the voicemail number.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- ① Note It is highly recommended to use the default voice mail number.

Setting Auto Redial

Tap Settings > Call settings > Auto Redial.

Setting TTY mode

The teletypewriter (TTY) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate via a telephone.

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > TTY mode.
- 2. Tap TTY Off, TTY Full, TTY HCO or TTY VCO.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- ① **Note** Make sure to connect a headset to the phone after selecting one of the TTY modes. Then, you can use the TTY function.

Setting DTMF Tones

DTMF (Dual Tone Multi Frequency), better known as touchtone, is a system of signal tones used in telecommunications. With DTMF, each key you press on your phone generates two tones of specific frequencies. So that a voice can't imitate the tones, one tone is generated from a high-frequency group of tones and the other from a low frequency group.

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > DTMF Tones.
- 2. Tap Normal or Long.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting Caller ID

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Caller ID.
- 2. Tap Network default, Hide number or Show number.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting Call forwarding

- 1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Call forwarding.
- Tap Always forward, Forward when busy, Forward when unanswered or Forward when unreachable.
- ① Note The user may be charged for this service.

Setting Call waiting

1. Tap Settings > Call settings > Call waiting > Call waiting.

Setting Noise Suppression

- 1. Tap **Settings** from the applications menu.
- 2. Tap Call settings > Noise Suppression.
 - By tapping the Noise Suppression, you can activate the function. The check box is selected by default.

Sound

Setting silent mode

- Tap Settings > Sound > Silent mode. All other functions except the media volume and alarms are silenced if you select this option.
- 2. Tap Silent mode again to activate all functions.

Setting vibration

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > Vibrate.
- Tap Always, Never, Only in Silent mode or Only when not in Silent mode.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting volume

- Tap Settings > Sound > Volume.
 Make sure to deselect Silent mode.
- Adjust the volume for ringtone, media and alarm. Tap Use incoming call volume for notifications if you want to use this function. Otherwise, deselect it and adjust the volume for notifications.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting phone ringtone

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > Phone ringtone.
- 2. Select and tap a ringtone in the list.
- 3. Tap **OK**.



Setting notification ringtone

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > Notification ringtone.
- 2. Select and tap a ringtone for notifications.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting feedback options

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound.
- 2. Tap **Audible touch tones** if you want to play tones when using the dial pad. It is selected by default.
- 3. Tap **Audible selection** if you want to play sound when making selection on the screen.
- 4. Tap **Screen lock sounds** if you want to play sound when locking and unlocking the screen.
- 5. Tap **Haptic feedback** if you want the phone to vibrate when you press soft keys. It is selected by default.

Setting Sound effect

- 1. Tap Settings > Sound > NASH Sound Effect.
- 2. Select and tap an effect from 3D sounds and equalizers. You can choose the user set.
- 3. Tap Done.

Display

Setting brightness

- 1. Tap Settings > Display > Brightness.
- 2. Drag to the right to increase the brightness. Drag it to the left to decrease the brightness.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting auto-rotate screen

 Tap Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen if you want to make the screen rotate automatically when you move the phone horizontally or vertically.

Setting animation options

- 1. Tap Settings > Display > Animation.
- 2. Tap No animations, Some animations or All animations.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Setting screen timeout

- 1. Tap Settings > Display > Screen timeout.
- 2. Select and tap the time interval to turn off the screen.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- ① **Note** Longer screen timeout intervals may adversely impact battery life.

Location & security

Setting my location

- 1. Tap Settings > Location & security > Use wireless networks.
- 2. Tap **Agree** to allow Google's location service to collect anonymous location data.
- 3. Tap **Use GPS satellites** if you want to find street-level locations.

Setting screen lock with a pattern key

- Tap Settings > Location & security > Set up screen lock > Pattern.
- 2. Read "Securing your phone" page and tap Next.

- 3. Watch how to set up the pattern and tap Next.
- ① **Note** Steps 2-3 appear only when you set up the pattern lock for the first time.
- 4. Drag your pattern on the screen and tap **Continue**. Make sure to connect the pattern with at least four dots. Tap **Retry** and draw another pattern if you want to set up one.
- 5. Tap Continue.
- 6. Drag the pattern again and tap Confirm.





Setting the pattern lock

Unlocking the pattern lock

• Note If you fail to drag the correct pattern to unlock the screen for five consecutive times, you have to wait for 30 seconds before you can try it again. If you forget your pattern lock, tap Forgot pattern, enter your account name and password for Google and create a new pattern lock. However, Forgot pattern will not appear if you have no Google account for the phone.

If you have forgotten your password for Google account, reset it at the Google website.

 - Fill in the form for Google Accounts Help if you have selected I no longer have access to these, and click Submit on the bottom of the window
- ① Note Do not select Text message to •••••••••30: You cannot receive a code to reset your password on your mobile phone.

Setting screen lock with a password

- Tap Settings > Location & security > Set up screen lock > Password.
- Enter your password and tap OK. The password should be at least 4 characters.
- 3. Enter the password again to confirm.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Unlocking the password lock

① Note Tap Settings > Location & security > Visible passwords if you want to see passwords as you type.

Setting screen lock with a PIN

- Tap Settings > Location & security > Set up screen lock > PIN.
- 2. Enter numbers as PIN and tap **Continue**. The PIN should be at least 4 characters.
- 3. Enter the numbers again to confirm.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

① Note Tap Settings > Location & security > Change screen lock if you do not want to set up an additional process to unlock the screen.

Setting SIM card lock

- Tap Settings > Location & security
 Set up SIM card lock.

- 3. Tap **Change SIM PIN** and enter the old SIM PIN and a new SIM PIN if you want to change the SIM PIN.

Setting the credential storage password

Applications

Managing applications

- Tap Settings > Applications > Manage applications > Downloaded
- Tap an application and tap Force stop if you want to force the application to stop. Tap Uninstall if you want to uninstall the application.
- 3. Tap **Running** on the top of the screen and tap an application to manage its operation.

Viewing running services and applications

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Running services.
- 2. Tap a service or an application to stop its operation or to edit its options.
- 3. Tap **Stop** if you want to stop its operation.
- ① **Note** It is recommended that the user only stops the applications user downloaded.

Checking the storage usage

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications
- 2. Tap **Storage use** to view a list of all applications on your phone with information about the storage they use.
- 3. Tap Force stop to force an application to stop, or tap Clear data to delete all the application's data permanently.

Checking the Battery usage

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications
- 2. Tap **Battery use** to open a list of the applications that have used battery power since you last charged your phone.

① Note See Adjust power use for information on how to reduce the battery use for application.

Debugging USB

The Debug mode disables drivers and allows the user to fix minor or major problems caused by the firmware.

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- Tap USB debugging to allow the debug mode when the USB cable is connected.
- 3. Read and tap **OK** on the USB debugging information page.

Allowing mock locations

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications > Development.
- 2. Tap **Allow mock locations** to pretend to be in another location for development purposes.

Allowing installation of unknown applications

- 1. Tap Settings > Applications.
- 2. Tap **Unknown sources** to allow non-market applications to be installed on the phone.
- ① Note Install applications only from trusted sources. Installing applications from unknown sources may introduce harmful virus, malware or expose phone and personal information to outside sources.

Accounts & sync

Managing background data

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap **Background data** if you want to sync, send and receive data any time.
- ① **Note** Some background applications may use large amounts of background data which may cause data usage overage.

Allowing background data to sync automatically

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap Auto-sync if you want to sync data automatically.

Adding an account

- 1. Tap Settings > Accounts & sync.
- 2. Tap Add account.
- 3. Select and tap an account type, and follow the necessary steps for creating an account.

Privacy

Backing up data

- 1. Tap Settings > Privacy.
- 2. Tap **Back up my data** if you want to back up your data.
- 3. Tap **Automatic restore** if you want to restore backed-up data for an application.

Resetting the phone

1. Tap Settings > Privacy.

- 2. Tap **Factory data reset** if you want to erase all data from the phone.
- 3. Tap Reset phone.
- 4. Tap Erase everything.
- ① Note To erase all the data on the phone's SD card, such as music or photos, select Erase SD card check box before tapping Reset phone.

SD card & phone storage

Selecting the USB mode

- 1. Tap Settings > Storage.
- 2. Tap **USB Mode**. If you turn on the USB debugging function, tap **OK** to turn it off.
- 3. Tap Media Transfer, Mass storage or Ask on connection, tap OK, and follow the relevant steps.

Viewing the status of space

- Tap Settings > Storage. The status of space available for the phone is displayed.
- Tap Unmount SD card > OK if you want to remove the SD card from the phone safely. Tap Mount SD card if you want to mount the card.
- 3. Tap **Erase SD card** to permanently erase everything on your phone's SD card and prepare it for use with your phone.
- 4. Tap **Erase Internal media storage** to erase all data on the internal media storage, such as music and photos.

Language & keyboard

Selecting a language

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Select language.
- 2. Select and tap a language to use for the phone.

Setting Swype

- Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Configure input methods > Swype (Swype Settings).
- 2. Adjust the following setting options.
 - **Word suggestion**: Sets to see suggested words as you type in the Swype.
 - **Auto-spacing**: Sets to insert spaces between words automatically.
 - Auto-capitalization: Sets to capitalize the first letter of sentence-initial words.
 - **Speed vs. accuracy**: Adjust the response speed by dragging the bar to the left or the right and tapping **OK**.

Setting the Android keyboard

- Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Configure input methods > Android keyboard (Android keyboard settings), and tap to enable or disable the functions for your preference.
- 2. Tap **Vibrate on keypress** to have the phone vibrate briefly each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.
- 3. Tap **Sound on keypress** to play a brief sound each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.
- 4. Tap **Popup on keypress** to prevent a larger image of each key from displaying above the key when you touch it.

- Tap Touch to correct words to turn off the feature that underlines a word in a text field with suggestions for other words to use.
- Tap Auto-capitalization to have the onscreen keyboard automatically capitalize the first letter of the first word after a period.
- 7. Tap **Show settings key** to open a dialog where you can set whether you want the keyboard to decide automatically whether to include the Settings key on the keyboard or whether you want always to show the Settings key or always to hide it.
 - This only works if you have more than one keyboard or other input method installed.
- 8. Tap **Voice input** if you want to change the method for voice input.
- 9. Tap **Input languages** to select the input language for the keyboard.

Setting the Android keyboard word suggestion

- Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > Configure input methods > Android keyboard (Android keyboard settings).
- Tap Quick fixes if you want to correct commonly typed mistakes. The check box is selected by default.
- 3. Tap **Show suggestions** if you want to see suggestions while you type. The check box is selected by default.
- 4. Tap **Auto-complete** if you want to insert highlighted word automatically.

Managing the user dictionary

- 1. Tap Settings > Language & keyboard > User dictionary.
- 2. Press and tap Add.
- 3. Enter the name of the dictionary in the box and tap **OK**.

Voice input & output

Text-to-speech helps listen to a text file by transforming it to a speech file.

Setting input options

- Tap Settings > Voice input & output > Voice recognizer settings.
- 2. Tap **Language**, select and tap a language that will be used for the input language.
- 3. Tap SafeSearch, and tap Off, Moderate or Strict for filtering input language.
- Tap Block offensive words if you want to hide recognized offensive voice results. The check box is selected by default.

Setting output options

- Tap Settings > Voice input & output > Text-to-speech settings.
- 2. Tap Install voice data that is required for speech synthesis.
- 3. Select and tap related application from the Android market and install it. Voice is offered when you finish installing the application.
- 4. Tap **Listen to an example** if you want to listen to an example.

- 5. Tap **Always use my settings** when you want to make your settings the default settings for the phone.
- 6. Tap Speech rate, select and tap an option, and tap OK.
- 7. Tap Language, select and tap a language, and tap OK.

Accessibility

Setting the accessibility option

- 1. Tap Settings > Accessibility.
- Tap OK in the "No accessibility related applications found" screen.
- 3. Select and tap related application from the Android Market and install it.
- 4. Tap Accessibility when you finish installing the application.
- Tap Power button ends call if you want to end a call by pressing the LOCK/PWR key.

Date & time

Allowing date and time to be set automatically

- 1. Tap **Settings** > **Date & time**.
- 2. Tap Automatic.
- ① Note Set date, Select time zone and Set time will not work if you tap

 Automatic

Setting the date

- 1. Tap Settings > Date & time > Set date.
- 2. Enter month, day and year for the phone.
- Tap Set.

Setting the time zone

- 1. Tap Settings > Date & time > Select time zone.
- 2. Select and tap a time zone in the list.

Setting time

- 1. Tap Settings > Date & time > Set time.
- 2. Enter the minute and the hour.
- 3. Tap Set.

Setting the 24-hour format

- 1. Tap Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Tap Use 24-hour format.

Selecting date format

- Tap Settings > Date & time > Select date format.
- 2. Select a preferred date format.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Software update

Checking for software updates

- 1. Tap Settings > AT&T software update.
- 2. Tap Check for updates.

About phone

Checking the status of the phone

1. Tap Settings > About phone.

2. Tap **Status** if you want to check the current status of the phone, including battery status, battery level and your phone number.

Checking battery use

- 1. Tap Settings > About phone.
- 2. Tap **Battery use** if you want to check how the battery is being used.

Seeing legal information

- 1. Tap Settings > About phone.
- 2. Tap **Legal information** if you want to see the open source licenses and Google's legal information.

Viewing the call & data usage

- 1. Tap Settings > About phone.
- 2. Tap **Call & Data Usage** to view the call time and cellular data usage information.

Resetting the phone

You can solve repeated problems by resetting the phone. Make sure to turn off the phone first to protect information and software in the phone.

- 1. Remove the battery cover and battery after turning off the phone.
- 2. Insert the battery into the phone right away.
- 3. Turn on the phone.

Appendix

To update software

You can update your software without visiting the nearest dealer.

- 1. Tap Settings > AT&T software update.
- 2. Tap **Check for updates** to check whether you need to update the software.
- ① Note After downloading the software, the device will ask you whether to update the software now. If you choose to update the software now, it will restart the handset. If you postpone updating the software, you can select between 1 hour, 4 hours or 8 hours in Options. After selecting the updating time, you will be sent back to standby mode. If you want to continue the process, go to Software Update and tap Resume Update.

To view the version of software

- 1. Tap Settings > About phone.
- 2. Scroll down to see the version of software.

Troubleshooting checklist

When audio quality is poor

End a call and try again.

When the other party cannot hear you speaking:

Your phone may be set to MUTE. Disable the MUTE function. Or your hand may be covering the microphone.

When battery life is shorter than usual

This may happen when you are in an area with low signal strength. Turn off your phone when it is not in use. Change the battery when battery energy is exhausted. Or turn off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and certain applications that may cause battery drain. Live Wallpaper also drains battery life.

When you cannot turn on your phone

Make sure your battery is charged. Check to see if your phone works while recharging the battery. Or remove and replace the battery with a new one.

When you are unable to send a message

This may happen when you are not registered to receive an SMS service, you may be in an area where your network service provider cannot provide such a service, or your phone memory is full

When you are unable to make a call

Your phone may be set to "fixed dial." Cancel the "fixed dial" function.

When you are unable to receive a call

Your phone may be set to "Call forwarding". Cancel the "Call forwarding" function.

When you are unable to charge the battery

This may be the result of one of the following three cases:

- 1. Your charger may be out of order. Contact your nearest dealer.
- 2. You may be attempting to use the phone in an overly hot/cold temperature. Try changing the charging environment.
- 3. Your battery may have not been connected to the charger properly. Check the connector.

When you are unable to input data into your Address Book: Your Address Book memory may be full. Delete some entries from your Address Book.

When you are unable to select a certain function:

You may not have subscribed to that function, or your network service provider may be in an area where such service cannot be provided. Contact your local service provider.

FCC Hearing-Aid Compatibility Regulations for Wireless Devices

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aids. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities.

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices

are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their boxes or a label located on the boxes.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

- M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/ higher of the two ratings.
- T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. T4 is the better/ higher of the two ratings.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise. The hearing aid and wireless phone rating values are then added together. A sum of 5 is considered acceptable for normal use. A sum of 6 is considered for best use.
